Before Your Delivery

As an expectant parent, you already know there's much to be done before the arrival of your baby. We're pleased and honored to offer a variety of services to help make these coming months as stress-free and productive as possible. Take a look at what you can expect from us, as well as some tips on how to prepare for your special day.

Make Admission Arrangements

We encourage you to pre-register by the fourth month of your pregnancy, so we may begin processing your admission paperwork before your delivery. To complete your admission online, visit BSWHealth.com and look for Patient Registration under Patient Tools. You will receive an email confirmation of your submission. If you have an out-of-pocket responsibility, you will receive a letter confirming your benefits and an estimate of what you will owe. If you would like

to check on the status of your registration, have questions or if there is a change in your pre-admission information, please contact our Maternity Financial Service Representative at 1.877.810.0372.

Select a Pediatrician

Prior to delivery, it is important that you select a pediatrician or family medicine doctor to see your baby. Your baby will need to be seen by his or her physician 48 hours after being sent home from the hospital. Speak with your obstetrician, call 1.844.BSW.DOCS or visit our website at BSWHealth.com for information regarding your choice of physician. If your pediatrician does not have hospital privileges at Baylor University Medical Center, will be provided during your hospital stay, and you will follow up with you selected pediatrician after discharge. All medical records will be sent to your doctor.

What to Bring for Mom

Items that you may want to bring include:

- Your driver's license, insurance card and list of medications
- Loose-fitting casual wear, nursing gown, bras and other breastfeeding-related clothing
- Underwear
- Toiletries (shampoo, toothpaste, etc.)

- · Robe
- Slippers or loose-fitting shoes
- Camera
- Cell phone charger
- Breastfeeding pillow
- Breast pump

What to Bring for Baby

While your baby is in the hospital, we will provide diapers, wipes, a T-shirt, hat and sleepsack. Items that you may want to bring include:

- Special clothing for baby's first picture
- Socks or booties
- Car seat that is weight and age appropriate for baby and not expired
- Pediatrician's name and contact information

We recommend that you have a certified car seat technician help you install your car seat before you deliver. Baylor Scott & White Health is a participant in the Safe Riders Traffic Safety Program, which offers parents child passenger safety education and consultations. Call 800.252.8255 to make an appointment.

Visitors During Labor

Family members are welcome. For the safety and privacy of our patients, we ask that you keep the hallways clear.

Photography and Videotaping

Video and still photography are allowed so that you may capture this special moment. You may be asked to stop photography at the discretion of the hospital staff.

You will enjoy the family-focused atmosphere provided in our beautifully decorated, private suites. You can plan on laboring, delivering and recovering all in the same room. If you have a planned or unplanned cesarean section, the operating suites and recovery are located conveniently on the first floor. There is plenty of room for your partner or another family member to spend the night.

Labor and Delivery

The birth of your child is truly a miracle, and it is our privilege to be a part of that miracle. From advanced technology and comfortable labor and delivery rooms to understanding the needs of family and friends, we're focused on making sure your delivery is as smooth and comfortable as possible. Our clinical team welcomes collaboration with doula support. Please notify your obstetrician if you wish to utilize these services during your delivery.

Our team will assist during your delivery and postpartum stay with amenities to make your experience more comfortable. These include:

- In room refrigerators
- Towel warmers
- Hair dryers
- Aromatherapy

- Wireless fetal monitoring to allow mobility
- Snack box upon arrival to the New Family Center

We are also here to help you manage pain during delivery, and offer a wide range of pain management options, including:

- Nitrous oxide
- Epidural or regional anesthetic
- IV medication
- Hydro therapy (laboring in water)

The circular drive entrance is easily accessed from Junius Street, with short-term maternity parking available. Visitors have easy access to the center via visitor parking garage 4 or 5 on Junius Street.


Upon entering the lobby, follow the signs to Labor and Delivery. After going through the automatic doors to the right (across from Maternity Observation), you will check in at the Labor and Delivery nurses' station.

Dedicated Antepartum Unit

The Antepartum Unit is for expectant women with high-risk pregnancies. Women who are admitted to the unit are considered at risk for pregnancy-related complications and require hospitalization prior to delivery. During a stay in Antepartum, you may also take part in physical therapy, occupational therapy and holistic healing offerings arts in medicine offerings such as music therapy. The unit also houses a celebration room where long-term patients may hold baby showers and/or family dinners.

After Delivery

The first few days after the birth of your baby, known as postpartum, are so important. With our family-focused care philosophy, we customize care based on your needs. Fathers or partners are an important part of this experience, and are encouraged to stay the night with mom and baby in our New Family Center. Our center is designed to create a calming environment and features all private rooms with hardwood floors, a daybed for your support person and hotel-style amenities such as in-room refrigerators and towel warmers.



Time With Baby (Couplet Care)

After the birth, you and your baby will be welcomed to our New Family Center. In this center, you will receive care together unless additional care is needed. (We also refer to this as Couplet Care.) We believe this time immediately after birth, while your baby is alert, is important. We encourage breastfeeding and skin-to-skin contact immediately after birth and throughout your stay. Your nurse will be available to assist you and the needs of your new baby.

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

Our NICU is a Level III unit that provides advanced life support services and technologies for premature and seriously ill newborns. Staffed by specialized nurses, neonatal nurse practitioners, neonatologists and many other skilled staff, the unit is designed to promote optimal developmental care for special infants.

Breastfeeding

Breastfeeding is recommended for the first year of your baby's life. Our New Family Center nurses have special training and are available to assist you in a positive breastfeeding experience. Lactation consultants are also part of the staff and are here to help you. We offer outpatient lactation services after discharge if additional help is needed. A class is also available to help you learn about breastfeeding. To register for a breastfeeding class, visit BSWHealth.com/Pregnancy or call 1.844.BSW.DOCS. Simply Mom's breastfeeding boutique has supplies you may need and is located on the first floor of Hoblitzelle Hospital. After you have left the hospital, we encourage you to join our Mommy and Me breastfeeding support and encouragement group.





Security

We have several security measures in place to protect you and your baby. Our staff will review these measures with you upon admission.

Family and Friends

Your family and friends are welcome to visit you and your baby during this exciting time. Other children or the baby's siblings should be accompanied by an adult and be free of illness during their visit. Please ask anyone who holds your baby to first wash his/her hands. Quiet time is daily from 1:00 - 3:00 PM. You may wish to limit visitors during this special time.

Professional Photography

A representative from a photography studio will come to your room to give you information about taking pictures. Each family receives a complimentary photo as well as the opportunity to buy more. With parents' written permission, your baby's picture will be placed on the Baylor Scott & White Babies section of BSWHealth.com/Babies. The baby's photo will usually be posted within two days after the picture has been taken. For security purposes, we do not include your baby's last name.

Special Tests for Your Newborn

Texas requires that your newborn be tested for metabolic disorders. These tests are performed when your baby is 24 to 36 hours old. The tests require a small blood sample that is collected through a heel stick. In addition, your baby will receive a pain-free hearing test and heart health screening. It is important that we have an accurate phone number for you so that we may reach you if there are any abnormal results. To find out more about these tests, please ask your nurse or call 1.844.BSW.DOCS.

Should your baby weigh less than five pounds or be younger than 37 weeks, a car seat test will be needed upon discharge.
